CHILD NO-IV PRE-OPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

Due to circumstances beyond our control, surgery time is determined by the surgery facility the business day before surgery. You will receive a call from the Surgery Center Nurse, so please be sure we have the correct phone number to reach you. If you are having surgery at the Surgery Center of Charleston and you do not receive a call before 4PM the business day before surgery, please call the Surgery Center of Charleston at 576-2600. Please read and follow all instructions below.

WHO SHOULD BRING YOU

You must have someone remain at the surgery center while you are in surgery.
CHILDREN-Limit the number of family members/friends that accompany to 2 persons.
Do not bring children unless they are having surgery.
Children that are not having surgery are not allowed in recovery room due to the sensitive nature and privacy of other patients.
Your child must have someone stay with them over night after the surgery.
Please bring a bottle or cup for juice for after surgery and a favorite comfort item (blanket, teddy bear, etc.)

MEDICATION

Do not take Aspirin, Motrin, ibuprofen product, vitamin E, all herbals (fish oil, St. John's Wort, etc.) or other anti inflammatory medications 10 days prior to surgery.
Your child may take Tylenol if needed.
If you have opted to have your prescriptions filled at the Surgery Center, then your prescriptions will be available to you or a member of your family prior to leaving the facility.

DIET

The Surgery Center will give you specific diet instructions when they call you preoperatively.
Up to 4 hours prior to your arrival time your child may have breast milk, and clear liquids (water, jello you can see through, apple juice, sprite, 7up, ginger ale.)
If the patient has anything to eat or drink after the time the surgery center instructs your child to stop eating/drinking, the surgery will be cancelled.
No formula for 6 hours prior to surgery.

HOW TO DRESS

Jewelry must be removed, this includes earrings
CHILDREN & INFANTS-Pajamas or sweats that are footless socks, shoes, and slippers that can be removed are ok.

WHAT TO EXPECT

After checking in, you and your child will be brought to a holding room where the nurse will prepare your child for the procedure. Your physician and anesthesiologist will come into answer any final questions. Your child will then be taken into the procedure room. They will breathe gas administered through a mask. It takes only a minute or two to achieve a satisfactory level of anesthesia. Once the procedure is complete your child will be transferred into the recovery room. We bring the parents back into the recovery room to be with your child promptly. At this point we encourage you to feed your child a bottle or breastfeed. It is during this period your child is likely fussy and crying while the anesthesia wears off. After your child is awake and has eaten some we will let you take them home. They may be sleepy or fussy for a few hours but most kids bounce back quickly and have a nearly normal rest of the day.
